the importance of yoga for physical fitness and mental well-being. Cadets performed yoga asanas with discipline and enthusiasm.



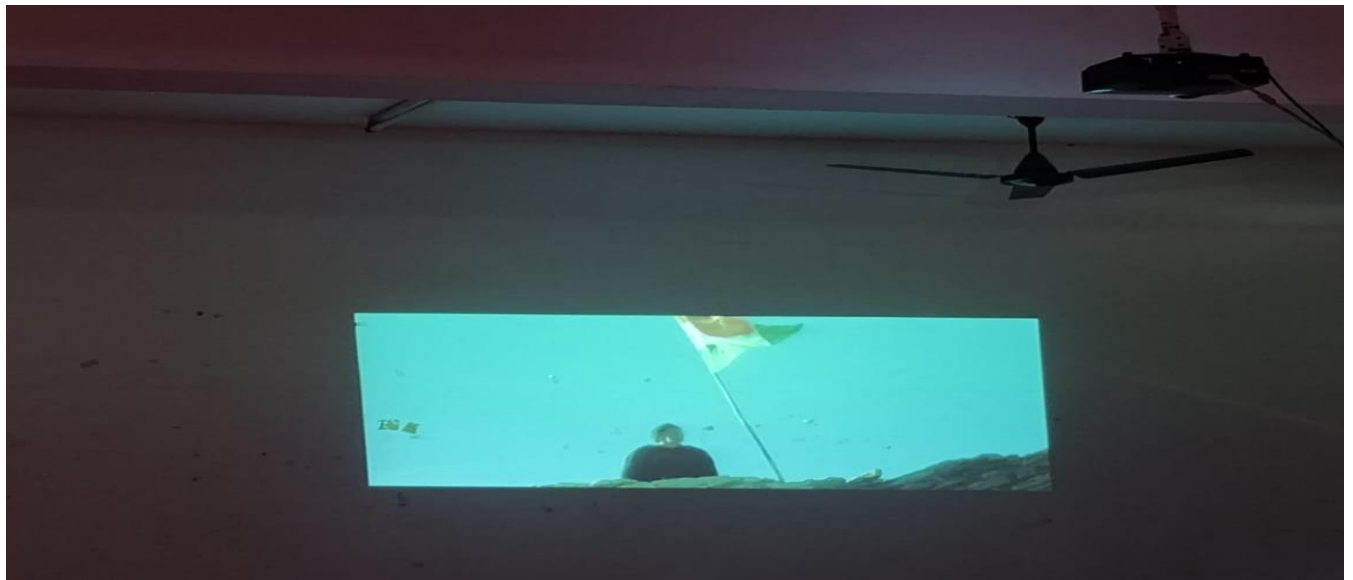
5.26/06/2025 Oath Taking Ceremony Against Drug Abuse

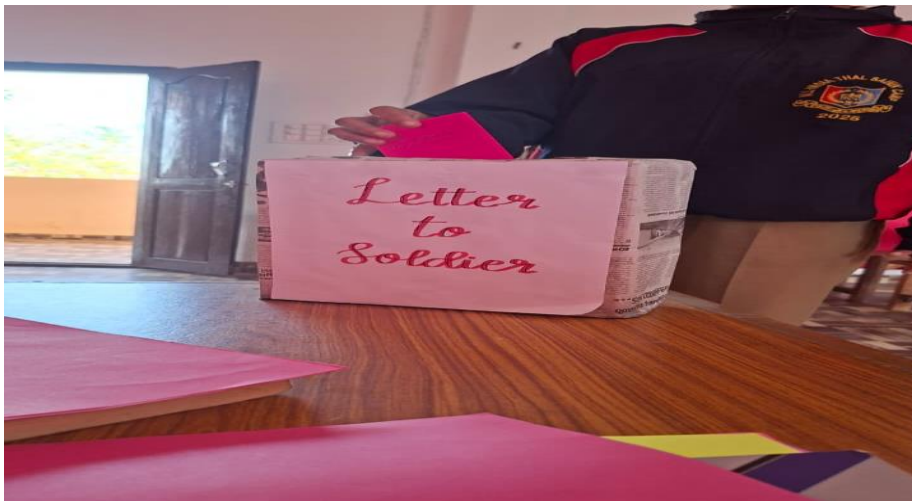
14. 24/11/2025 – NCC Day Celebration

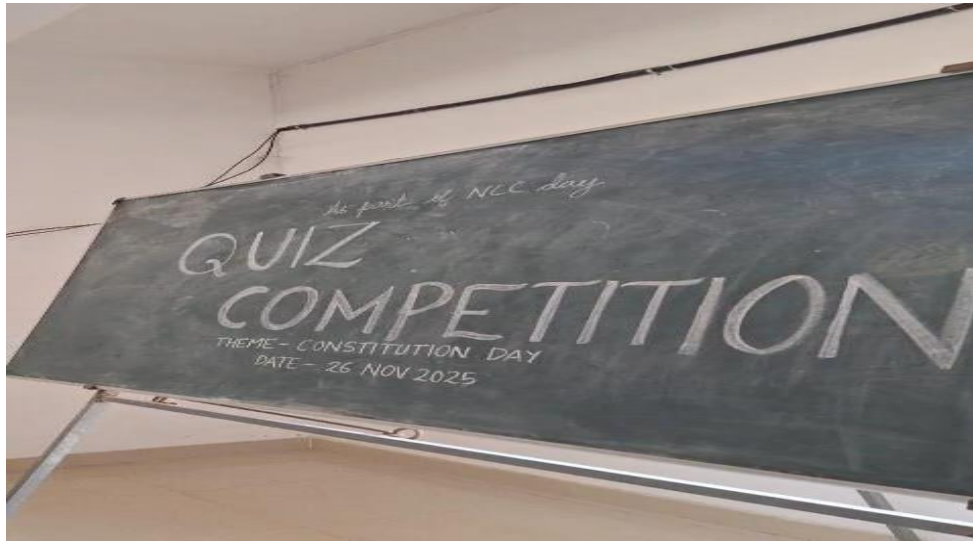
17. 25/11/2025 – Orange the World Campaign
