




# 5.Report on Nutrition for All – Exhibition on Nutrition and Health – Organized by the Women's Cell – September 27, 2024






### 7.Report on Breast Cancer Awareness Program – Organized by the Women's Cell in Association with Rajagiri Hospital – October 24, 2024

### 8. Report on "Orange the World" Campaign – Mercy College Women's Cell Date: December 5, 2024




