The Department of Languages (Malayalam, Hindi & Sanskrit), Mercy College, Palakkad, organized an intensive workshop for the First Year FYUG students on 10th July 2025 at the College Auditorium. The programme aimed to enhance students' linguistic proficiency, expand their awareness of regional languages, and introduce them to the applications of technology in the field of language learning. The workshop focused on two key themes. The first, Language Skills and Regional Linguistic Knowledge, emphasized the importance of mastering reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills while also developing an understanding of the diversity of regional languages. The sessions highlighted the cultural richness embedded in different linguistic traditions and stressed the need to respect multilingual contexts in both academic and professional spheres. The second theme, Language and Technology, addressed the increasing role of technology in language acquisition, translation, research, and communication. Students were introduced to various digital tools, online platforms, and Al-based applications that can support language learning, documentation, and the preservation of lesser-known languages. The resource person, Prof. T.K. Thomas (Assistant Professor, Christ College, Irinjalakuda), conducted the sessions in an engaging and interactive manner, blending theoretical insights with practical examples. His lectures encouraged students to think critically about how technology can serve as a bridge between languages while maintaining the integrity of linguistic identity in a rapidly digitizing world.Organized under the IQAC initiative CUBA, the workshop provided a meaningful learning experience, equipping students with practical skills and a deeper appreciation of linguistic diversity in contemporary society.
