

The second year NSS volunteers gave a send-off to the existing Programme Officers Ms. Rakhi N.P. and Dr. Priya Varma. Volunteers gave a warm welcome to the new Programme Officers Dr. Anu Kuruvilla and Dr. Deepa N. who took charge of NSS from July 1<sup>st</sup> 2023. Volunteers shared their experience and also gave a brief note on the activities done during their first year.

Second year NSS volunteers were asked to assemble in the seminar hall on 10.7.2023. Action Plan of NSS for the year 2023-24 was discussed in detail. Volunteers came up with the list of activities to be done during the year. 100 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



National Service Scheme Units organised an Anti-drug Campaign on July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023 in association with Gandhi Darshan Samithi State Committee. The state level campaign was inaugurated by Sri. Ramesh Chennithala MLA, (Former Leader of Opposition, Kerala Legislative Assembly). Second year NSS Volunteers and other college students attended the session "SAY NO TO DRUGS". Drug use and its dangerous effects was beautifully explained by Sri. Ramesh Chennithala. He said that drugs can harm brain and body, sometimes permanently. It can hurt the people around us, including friends, families, kids, and even unborn babies. 



The second-year volunteers participated actively in the cleaning programme by cleaning the allotted area in the campus. 54 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



NSS units of the college has set a fruit garden Volunteers also did the maintenance work and cleaning of the fruit garden already set in the previous year by NSS units. Its main aim is to protect our nature by planting trees and maintaining it. The fruit trees like mango, pomegranate, lemon, banana, rambutan, guava etc are grown in it and are well maintained by the volunteers. NSS units organised Vasudha Vandan by the maintenance of Fruit Garden with 26 saplings plantation. Fruit saplings were planted in the garden by the volunteers on 09.08.2023. The "Vasudha Vandan" programme aimed to promote unity and inclusivity, emphasizing the importance of a harmonious society. 21 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



Veeron Ka Vandan- "the nationwide campaign will celebrate the achievements of the nation and Bravehearts." The initiative aims to honour the nation's heroes. NSS units decided to honour a Kargil war hero from Palakkad Ex Hav. Radhakrishnan C.V MEG Indian Army. Sri. Radhakrishnan C.V. is the only person in Palakkad who survives now after injury in Kargil War. On 14.08.2023, Sri. Radhakrishnan C.V. shared his duty and life in Indian Army, elaborated the Kargil war experience with the students and also discussed about the job opportunities in India Army. College Vice Principal Dr. Sr. N.M. Louly honoured Ex Hav. Radhakrishnan C.V.

with a shawl and memento. 62 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



The NSS units initiated the pledge on 14.08.2023 to uphold the ideals of Panch Pran, which include fostering national development, eradicating the mindset of subservience, embracing our rich heritage, promoting unity and solidarity, fulfilling civic duties, and showing respect to the defenders of the nation. NSS volunteers and other students of the college, teachers and non-teaching staff members participated in the programme and took Panch Pran oath. 97 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



On 15<sup>th</sup> August 2023 NSS volunteers participated in the Independence Day programme organised in the college. On 12.08.2023, 13.08.2023 and 25.08.2023 NSS Volunteers participated in the Swachh Sarvekshan 2023 One Citizen One Feedback survey organised by Palakkad Municipality. The survey has been instrumental in fostering a spirit of healthy competition among towns and cities to improve their service delivery to citizens and towards creating cleaner cities.





Students accompanied the Health inspectors of the municipality and collected the details regarding urban sanitation and cleanliness from the people of the muncipal area. Through the participation in the survey, Volunteers could encourage large scale citizen participation and could create awareness amongst all sections of society about the importance of working together towards making towns and cities better places to reside in. 92 second year volunteers participated in the programme.



First year students interested in joining NSS were asked to assemble in the auditorium on 08.09.2023. A discussion on the activities under NSS was discussed again with the students. Screening of students was done and a final list of students as volunteers for NSS was prepared by the Programme Officers.



A personality development session was organised on 12.09.2023 for the first year NSS volunteers. The session was organised in association with Holy family college of Education for Women, Koduvayur. Ms. Reo July Jipsa, Assistant Professor Holy Family College of Education for Women, Koduvayur handled a wonderful session titled "What Defines you as a Person" for the volunteers. The session was very informative and helped to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats of the students. It provided them with insights and suggestions on how to improve their performance and achieve your goals. 91 first year volunteers participated in the programme.



National Eye Donation Fortnight has been observed annually between August 25th to September 8th throughout the country to raise awareness about the importance of eye donation and debunk the myths surrounding it. Mercy College NSS Units organised an Eye Donation awareness programme on 14.09.2023 in association with Sakshama (Samadrishti Kshamathavikas Mandal) Kerala an organization working for physically challenged. Mr Prakash, Secretary, Sakshama, Palakkad and Mr Sasi Kumar, Member, Sakshama State Committee gave a briefing on the importance of organ donation to the students. A short film "Mayaatha Marivillu" which highlights on the importance and need of eye donation was screened for the students. 100 second year volunteers and 112 other students of the college participated in the programme.







The theme for Swachhata Hi Seva 2023 is "Garbage Free India". On 23.09.2023 and 24.09.2023, 70 first year NSS volunteers participated in the campus cleaning activity as part of the Swachhata Hi Seva 2023 programme. September 24 is observed as NSS Day. Mercy College NSS units 06,34 decided to celebrate NSS day by arranging a food packet distribution programme on 25<sup>th</sup> September and a visit to nearby old age home on 29<sup>th</sup> September,2023.

On 25.09.2023, First year NSS volunteers were asked to bring food packets from home. Students brought food packets. 102 food packets were distributed by the students to the needy people in the street near Town bus stand and Palakkad railway station. Feeding the homeless is important because people are left with relatively limited or poor-quality food choices and moreover the homeless may not have food without this. The initiative took a bite out of hunger of the people in the Palakkad municipality area.





On 29.09.2023, First year NSS volunteers visited Mercy Home – Home for the Old Aged and Destitute women at 12.20 PM. CMC sisters are rendering their services whole-heartedly to the Destitute and Aged women. They have succeeded in making them lead a life of love and peace. Volunteers entertained the inmates by singing and dancing which made them really happy. Volunteers also handed over the amount collected from the college for the purchase of essentials to the inmates.





On 01.10.2023 first year and second year NSS volunteers participated in the cleaning drive campaign- Shramadan from 10 AM to 11 AM at Palakkad Railway Junction (Olavakkode). 





The free cataract surgery was done successfully on 5th November 2023 for 20 people.


