The college neither charges any capitation fee nor accepts any donation as consideration for admission.

PAYMENT AND DEFAULT OF FEES

1. Tuition fee will be collected in June and it includes the special fee. This is collected on the date of admission from newly admitted students. Others have to pay within a week from the date of re-opening. Students should bring their college ID card for all office transactions.
2. Subsequent instalments shall be collected before the 7th consecutive working day of the month on the day allotted to each class. Students are advised to bring exact amount of fee to avoid inconvenience.
3. The due date for paying fee is marked in the calendar. On failing to pay the fee within due date :
 - a) The student can pay the fee with a fine of Rs. 5/- if paid within ten days from the due date.
 - b) After this date the student can pay the fee with a fine of Rs. 10/- if paid within ten days from the extended date. After that, those who have not paid the fee, will be removed from the roll. Re-admission will be done only after the payment of re-admission fee of Rs. 50/- and tuition fee with fine.
4. If the fee is not paid within the specified time the student's name will be removed from the register. She will be re-admitted only with the special permission of the Principal, on the payment of arrears of fees with fine.
5. Students who are admitted only for a term should pay one-third of the tuition fee for the year together with the full special fee miscellaneous fee.
6. Fee once remitted will not be refunded.

STUDENTS' AID FUND

Deserving students may apply to the Principal for financial assistance from Students' Aid Fund, before 30 November.

RULES OF WITHDRAWAL

Students applying for transfer certificates during a term on any day on which they are on the rolls of the college will be granted such certificate on payment of all arrears of fee and other dues.

1. Rules for issue of transfer and conduct certificates.
 - i) Transfer certificate shall not be issued without payment of arrear.
 - ii) No fee will be levied from those who apply for the transfer certificate either at the time of leaving the college or within one year after leaving the college. A student will be deemed to have left the college on the date of closing.
 - iii) A fee of Rs. 10/- (ten only) will be levied from those who apply for the transfer certificate one year after leaving the College.
 - iv) An additional fee of Rs. 25/- (twenty five) will be levied from those who apply for duplicate copies of the transfer certificate. A duplicate copy can be issued only on production of a certificate from a responsible 1st class Judicial Magistrate to the effect that the original has been irrecoverably lost by the candidate.
 - v) Fine for duplicate identity card is Rs.100/-.
 - vi) No fee will be levied for the issue of course and conduct certificate. A conduct certificate to any student will not be issued as a matter of course.

2. A student will be considered to have been enrolled in a term if she has attended the college, received instruction at least for one day of that term or has paid the fee or a part of it prescribed thereof.
3. A student who is found to have obtained admission by misrepresentation of any sort will be dismissed with forfeiture of the fee she may have paid.
4. A student who applies for T.C. needs to surrender the college I.D. Card and Library card at the college office and library respectively.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF STUDENTS

1. Students are expected to attend the college on all working days. Regular class hours are from 9.30 am to 4.00 pm It should be noted that a student should avail only 9 days of leave per semester. Deficiency will be condoned only where the Syndicate is satisfied that the absence was for reasons beyond the control of the student. Exemption will not be granted for more than one academic year in any course of study. If the deficiency is not condoned by the University, the student will not be allowed to appear for the exam.
2. Attendance will be marked every hour in Linways, which is required for APC
3. Application for leave must be made before hand. Leave will be sanctioned only by the Principal.
4. In case of illness or other unforeseen cause the application for leave must be submitted on the first day of the student's return to college. The application for leave submitted by the hostellers must bear the initials of the concerned warden.
5. Application for leave in case of sickness should be accompanied by a certificate from a registered medical officer not lower in rank than that of an Assistant Surgeon.

6. Attendance for examinations is compulsory except in case of illness or other unforeseen circumstances.
7. Students who absent themselves for one hour during the forenoon / afternoon will lose half-a-day's attendance.
8. Absence without leave will be penalised at the discretion of the Principal.
9. Students should not participate in any tournaments/ competitions outside the college without prior sanction from the Principal.
10. The academic performance of students will be evaluated twice each semester. Marks obtained by the students will be communicated to the parent or guardian through periodical meetings.

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Students should come modestly dressed. They are permitted to wear only the prescribed college uniform during working days. Students will not be permitted to use gold ornaments other than a pair of ear-rings. A fine of Rs. 25/- may be collected for each of other ornaments worn.
2. Students should greet members of the staff.
3. On any member of the staff entering the class, the students shall rise and stand till they are desired by her to be seated.
4. Students can enter or leave a classroom or laboratory only with the permission of the lecturer.
5. Silence should be observed during class-hours and self-restraint during intervals.

6. Damage done to college property will be strictly penalised.
7. Any misbehaviour will be strictly dealt with.
8. Students are forbidden to organise any meeting or collect money without the permission of the Principal.
9. No notice should be posted on the notice-board without the permission of the Principal.
10. Students should read the notice put up on the notice-board carefully.
11. Strict action will be taken against students involved in ragging within the campus and in the premises of the hostel.
12. College election is conducted in the Parliamentary model.
13. No visitors will be allowed during class-hours.
14. Parents can take their wards from the college during class- hours only in cases of emergency with the permission of the Principal.
15. Students are not permitted to wander about during class-hours.
16. The college is not responsible for the loss of money, articles etc. The students are expected to take good care of their belongings.
17. Students should assemble in their respective classrooms for morning assembly and prayer. They are expected to observe silence during the prayer.
18. Resident students must conform to the rules and regulations of the hostel.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Strict silence is to be observed in the library.
2. Reading-room is open from 8.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on all working days.
3. Open access system is followed in the library. Books should not be misplaced as they may be lost.
4. Post-graduate students are allowed to take five books at a time and under graduate students, three books at a time from different sections. “Reference Section” is to be consulted within the library. Book reservation facility is also available in the library. Books are issued for 14 days. A fine of Rs. 1 a day will be levied if a book is not returned after 14 days. The amount has to be paid at the college office.
5. Students are not allowed to exchange, pass on or lend library books to those in or outside the college. Students are strictly forbidden to take books on behalf of other students.
6. Damage or loss of books taken should be immediately reported to the librarian and members may replace such books or pay the fine fixed as per government norms.
7. Personal belongings such as books, umbrellas, boxes and others. should be left outside the reading-room. Students are allowed to carry only pen and paper inside the library or reading-room. These are to be shown at the counter, while entering and leaving the library. Students are advised not to leave money and valuables in their bags.
8. Research scholars of any discipline from other research centres can avail library books with a half-yearly membership fee of Rs.600/- or Rs. 1200/- for a year. Research scholars should

produce their identity cards at the library. Only 4 books can be taken at a time. If books are not returned within the specified period, a fine will be levied. A caution deposit of Rs. 2000/- has to be remitted, which will be refunded when the No-dues Certificate is obtained from the library. In case books taken get damaged, the caution deposit will not be refunded. If a book gets lost, it has to be replaced.

9. Students from other colleges can only refer books in the library.
10. Issue days: Monday to Friday
11. Issue time : 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
